

"In schools in which the MYP finishes with year 5 of the programme, all students must complete the personal project, with the majority of their work undertaken in the final MYP year. Students are expected to spend approximately 25 hours on their personal project." (IB Projects Guide, p.







The IB MYP Certificate

In the final year of the MYP, 10th grade, students have the opportunity to earn an IBMYP Certificate.

In order to earn the certificate students must:

- be in the second year of a language
- have a GPA of C+ (2.3) or better
- complete 3 reflections on community service
- complete a personal project (Passion Project) and
 - score a 10 or higher out of 32



Career - Related Programme (CP) Junior & Senior Year

CTE Courses

- Sequential courses taken in a chosen career-related field of study
- Industry recognized certification

IB Diploma Courses

- Two diploma program courses
- IB Approaches to Learning I and II
- Language Development
- Service Learning
- Reflective Project about ethical dilemma in career field





Diploma Programme (DP) Junior & Senior Year

- Six IB courses (five are two-year courses)
- Theory of Knowledge
- Extended Essay
- Creativity, Activity, Service







US universities evaluate academic grades in the context of a student's high school curriculum and its degree of rigour. The two-year IB Diploma Program is widely regarded as an academically demanding syllabus, and one that provides excellent preparation for college level coursework.

A survey of more than 4,000 students conducted by the International Insight Research Group in partnership with the International Baccalaureate Organisation (IBO) showed that the acceptance rate of IB students into Ivy League universities is up to 18% higher than the total population acceptance rate. The gap is even more significant for top-ranked universities outside of the Ivy League, where it is 22% higher, on average.





Elective Options: Semester (Half-Year)

Art Foundations: Explore a variety of art materials, develop art techniques and use creative skills.

+ Art Foundations is a prerequisite
+ 3D Art Exploration: Construct and
form 3D sculptures, ceramic
objects, models, and installations
that express creativity.

+ Computers in Art: Work with a variety of software applications, tools, and equipment to create digital images, interactive art, animations & games.



<u>Theatre</u>: Through observing & participating in a variety of performance activities students will enhance creativity, confidence and communication.

Tech Theatre: Students develop an appreciation of technical theatre, sound, scenery, costumes, and stage management. Students will develop skills in listening, collaborating, and discussing in group situations. Students will explore and design technical theatre elements.

Family & Consumer Sciences 1&2:

Project based class that focuses on personal development. Students work in the sewing and cooking labs.



Elective Options: Semester (Half-Year)

Computer Solutions: Students learn proper typing technique, computer components, and the use of the Microsoft Office Program.

Coding & Innovative

Technologies: Introduces students to coding & emerging technology through hands-on projects, through a variety of apps and interactive websites. Students will complete individual and small group projects.

Coding & Innovative

Technologies 2: Building on the knowledge from Coding & Innovative Technologies class, students further develop their coding skills through hands on projects. Will learn more advanced coding concepts.



Elective Options: Semester (Half Year)

<u>Creative Writing:</u> Students develop their creative writing skills by writing poetry, short stories and plays.

<u>Media Communications</u>: Students will gain skills in audio and video editing, script writing, creating storyboards, interview skills, digital photography, and using computer software by working on the daily news show.

Engineering 1 & 2: In this project-based course students apply the engineering design process to solve real world problems.
